Even before the warriors were put back together, researchers could tell that each one looked internet. Some seemed older than others. Eyes and noses were different shapes. Each statue had its own hairstyle. There were many varieties of clothes and shoes on the warriors. Some smiled, while others seemed angry. Some had mustaches and beards. Others looked too young to have facial hair at all. Their sizes and poses were all slightly different as well.

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There were several kinds of warriors. The clothing and weapons on the statues showed what role each soldier played in the army.
