MyOn is an online library of over 7000 e-books. Best of all, the website was created by the people who made Accelerated Reader, so you can quiz on a book as soon as you finish reading it!

Go to

1. www.myon.co.uk
2. Type in 'The Halley Academy' and then click on the name when it appears on the dropdown menu.
3. Use your username from AR: 1st letter of your first name, then first four letters of your last name.
4. If your username isn't working, you may need to add a 1 to the end.
5. Password is 'abc'.




myON is here to help ensure your students can keep reading and learning even if schools close. To support you and your students, please see the learning and implementation resources available on our Renaissance at Home hub.

WARRIORS OF ALL KINDS

Even before the warriors were put back together, researchers could tell that each one looked **different**. Some seemed older than others. Eyes and noses were different shapes. Each statue had its own hairstyle. There were many varieties of clothes and shoes on the warriors. Some smiled, while others seemed angry. Some had mustaches and beards. Others looked too young to have facial hair at all. Their sizes and poses were all slightly different as well.



There were several kinds of warriors. The clothing and weapons on the statues showed what role each soldier played in the army. Statues of many common soldiers wore tunics and carried swords and shields. Some wore fishscale armor, which helped protect ancient Chinese warriors in battle. Warrior statues with longer beards were placed behind the ranks of soldiers. These statues were of older warriors, maybe officers. Most of the soldiers were standing, but some were kneeling. Many of the kneeling statues were archers designed to hold real bows and arrows or crossbows.



Most of the Terracotta Army figures held actual weapons. The weapons were not made of terracotta. They slowly fell apart after being buried for centuries due to moisture in the soil.
