Of course we would like to see this percentage increase, but we are moving in the right direction. 90% of parents said their child is happy at school and 88% said their child is taught well at this school. We look forward to improving these scores further as we move ahead together.

Our Turing students continue to impress us with their commitment to their learning and dedication to extra curricular activities. Mubarrak in Year 8 competed in 100m and 200m at the Cambridge Schools Cup

against other Greenwich schools. He clocked 12.3 and 25.3 seconds respectively, with his 100m time recorded as the fastest time this year in the whole of the UK for his age group. A special mention must also go to; Charlie, Nixon, Gezz, Nikan and Clinton who represented the academy brilliantly.

As well as sporting achievements, two of our students were awarded the Jack Petchey award.
